Trilogy Challenge Rules:

- a. When in doubt, PDGA rules apply.
- b. Standard 18-hole course is in play.
- c. Only player pack discs may be used. Spare or replacement discs may be purchased.
- d. Play with a group of 2-4. Player scores must be witnessed by the group.
- e. Out of bounds: When a player's disc lies in any of the following areas, it is out of bounds. Player scores a penalty throw and shoots again from either last lie or spot where disc went out of bounds.
 - i. Water
 - ii. Roads and parking areas
 - iii. Fairway or playing area of another hole
 - iv. Any area where it is dangerous to retrieve a disc or throw next shot
- f. Count the total number of shots, including penalties, for the hole.
- g. Official round is used for score. Additional casual rounds may be played if desired.
- h. This in intended to be an encouraging and fun event for players of any experience level, including newbie and recreational. Use casual play. Don't be a disc golf snob.
- i. Player disputes that cannot be solved in a friendly manner can be brought to the tournament director.

IEEE Disc Golf Trilogy Challenge August 29, 2020 Campville Commons Campville, NY



Disc Golf Gameplay:

The object of the game is to traverse a course in the fewest number of throws of the disc.

Each throw is made from where the disc came to rest after the last throw. The player stands directly behind the area where the disc last came to rest until the release of their next shot.

Each hole starts from the tee box and ends when the player holes out at the basket. For all tee shots, players must release the disc with their entire body within the tee box area. Failing to do so will result in a penalty stroke. To complete a hole, the disc must come to rest supported by the chains or within the basket.

Discs that are interfered with by obstacles (e.g. trees, animals, buildings) are played from where they come to rest. Discs that are interfered with by people (e.g. erroneously picking up the wrong disc) will be placed at best estimate of where they were when interference occurred.

Score is determined by counting the number of throws made on each hole plus penalty throws and then summing all holes. Winner completes the course with the lowest score.

- 0945 Begin Disc Golf round
- 1230 Lunch Turn in disc golf scores
- 1300 Disc golf winners announced
- 1330 Casual round of disc golf begins.
- 1700 Event ends

Player Packs

Pick up player packs at the registration table.

These are the only discs that may be used during this tournament. Additional discs may be purchased individually (\$15) or in a full player pack (\$40) at the event.
